ORDINANCE 05-96

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO AN INCREASE IN SEWER RATES

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rivers owns and operated a sanitary sewer collection and treatment system and,

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rivers last revised rates at sixty percent (60%) of the water bill in 1978 and,

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rivers has absorbed the increase in the cost of labor, equipment, and parts in the operation and maintenance of its sewerage facilities and,

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rivers must revise its rate structure to overcome this cost factor in order to have sufficient revenue to operate and maintain the sewerage facilities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF GRAND RIVERS, KENTUCKY.

SECTION 1. The monthly charge for sewerage services will no longer be based on a percentage of the water rate.

SECTION 2. The monthly sewerage services charge shall be based upon a flat charge basis per thousand gallons used.

SECTION 3. The monthly rate for sewerage shall be: First 2,000 gallons - \$6.75 minimum. All over 2,000 gallons - \$3.25 per 1,000 gallons metered potable water.

SECTION 4. The tap-on fee for sewerage service is hereby increased from \$400.00 per tap for each unit to \$800.00 per tap per unit.

SECTION 5. The revised rates shall become effective immediately after passage and publication.

SECTION 6. All other ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
